- **DER KURIER**, quarterly newsletter published in March, June, September, and December. Articles, specific to German research such as the “Fraktur Forum” are included. Other items covered are: book reviews and publications, members’ queries, members’ Ahnentafels or ancestral charts, recent library acquisitions, and other genealogical society activities.

- A lending **LIBRARY** of genealogical books, compact digital disks, newsletters and periodicals focusing on Germanic families and five centuries of German immigration. These materials are available through the Shenandoah County Library in Edinburg, Virginia. These materials are available to all members in good standing through a mail-and-loan program with a one-time security deposit. 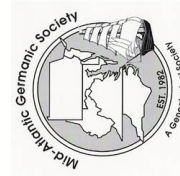
